

Redwood National Park: Brown Bag Invited Speaker

Invited speaker: Mourad W. Gabriel M.S., Ph.D. candidate

This talk will discuss the current health issues that Mourad Gabriel and his collaborators are finding in sensitive forest carnivores in California. Mourad is president of Integral Ecology Research Center and is a doctoral candidate at the University of California Davis, School of Veterinary Medicine. He will focus on fishers and their exposure and poisoning from anticoagulant rodenticides. He will discuss the potential point sources for these toxicants, and additional risks from other toxicants that fishers are or could be exposed to. Finally, Mourad will discuss potential impacts and risks to other sensitive species that are currently sympatric with the fisher or may be in the future due to local reintroductions in northern California. These include species like the Humboldt marten, spotted owl, Sierra Nevada red fox and California condor.
